## Physique Art Curriculum

**Week 1 - 4th of July** Campers will make Abstract Fireworks, using drops of paint and straws to blow the paint around on the paper to create the illusion of fireworks. Campers will make Star Spangled Illuminations, using brown paper bags, tissue paper, sand and candles.

**Week 2 - Animal** Campers will study different animals and insects outside in the park. They will take photos and sketch their objects. Campers will then make 3D sculptures, detailed drawings and paintings of their animals. They will also write a short imaginary story relating to the animal and it's environment. Campers will make a "birdhouse" structure to house their selected animal. This will be created out of cardboard and then decorated with found objects from the outdoors, as well as paint and collage.

**Week 3 - Photography** Campers will study different photographers and different types of cameras. They will assemble their own pinhole camera using cardboard boxes, tape, and film. Campers will take a photo outside with the camera they have made. They will also make frames for their photos.

**Week 4 - Printmaking** Campers will study a different technique of printmaking each day of the week. They will create different images using sponges and stencils, Styrofoam, fruits and vegetables, a collective wood cut prints, and silk-screening.

**Week 5 - Super-heroes** Campers will create their own character of a super-hero. They will include what this character wears, its powers, weapons, where it lives, what it eats. They will draw their own short cartoon based on their character.

**Week 6 - Realism, Surrealism and Abstraction** Campers will study different genres of art history and artists that exemplify these styles. Campers will then create three different pieces based on the same subject matter using these three different styles.

**Week 7 - Collage and Portfolio Assembly** Campers will create collages using magazines, photographs, found objects, pen, pencil, and paint. This will be made in the style of their choice. Campers will also put together a portfolio of the work they have created over the summer. They will assemble their work in chronological order, as well as label and sign all of their works.

# Summer Camp Art Program

Physique's Summer Camp provides art education through a range of projects designed to challenge and stimulate campers. Each week of camp has a different theme, where campers learn about a variety of artists and art processes. Campers use a wide range of methods and materials to create their artwork, from drawing, painting, photography, printmaking, and collage. At least once a day campers work on their art projects outside, drawing inspiration from scenic Battery Park.
